Students in AMDP use TC 165 to meet the US Diversity Requirement and TC 362 or 472 to meet the International Perspectives Requirement.

Note: This sequence is only an example. The number of credits taken each semester should be based on the individual student's situation. Factors that may affect credit hours per semester include student ability, employment, health, activities, and grade point considerations.

All students majoring in Apparel Merchandising, Design, and Production are required to earn a C- or better in all Textiles and Clothing courses applied toward the degree, including transfer credits. Also, to receive a degree in Textiles and Clothing at ISU, a minimum of 18 credits must be taken in the ISU Textiles and Clothing Department; 12 of the 18 credits must be in 300-400 level courses.

No course may be applied to more than one degree requirement except those used to meet CFCS core, US Diversity and International Perspectives requirements.
